


Barron County Recycling promotes "backyard composting" of yard and garden waste. For information on how to start your own home backyard composting program, call Barron County Recycling at 357-6566.



## **Barron County Recycling Ordinance**

### **To whom it applies:**

- All of Barron County, except the City of Rice Lake and the Town of Rice Lake
- All residences, multi-family, commercial, and industrial entities

### **What it requires:**

- The ordinance requires everyone to separate from their refuse and recycle the following items:
  - √ Tin/steel containers
  - √ Aluminum containers
  - √ Glass containers

### **Penalties:**

- \$50 for the first offense
- \$200 for the second offense
- \$2,000 for the third or subsequent offenses

# BARRON COUNTY RECYCLING PROGRAM



## Tin, steel, and aluminum cans and containers

### Recyclable:

- Aluminum cans
- Tin or steel food containers

### Preparation:

- Remove labels
- Rinse Thoroughly
- Store with plastic containers

## Glass containers

### Recyclable:

- Food jars and bottles
- Beverage containers, pop, water, beer, and liquor
- Clear, brown, or green

*THE TRUE COLOR OF GLASS CAN BE SEEN BY LOOKING AT THE BOTTOM EDGES!*

### Preparation:

- Remove caps
- Rinse clean
- Separate by color—clear, brown, and green

### Not recyclable:

- **NO** cups, plates, dishes, and all other porcelain and ceramic
- **NO** drinking glasses, crystal, and heat-resistant ovenware
- **NO** light bulbs, flower pots, and glass bowls
- **NO** auto glass, plate glass, sheet glass, and mirrors



## Plastic containers

### Recyclable:

- Milk and juice containers
- Pop and water bottles
- Laundry and soap bottles
- Other "narrow-necked" containers with the following symbols:



### Preparation:

- Remove caps and rings
- Rinse thoroughly
- Store with tin and aluminum containers

### Not recyclable:

- **NO** wide-mouthed containers
- **NO** ice cream buckets, margarine tubs, etc.
- **NO** dirty or food-filled containers
- **NO** pesticide containers
- **NO** plastic bags, film/wrap, cottage cheese containers, deli containers, etc.



## Storage at home and at the drop box

### Problem areas:

1. Motor oil in recycling box
2. Dirty food jars
3. Glass colors mixed
4. Window pane in glass
5. Cardboard boxes and plastic bags in recycling box
6. Metal in recycling box
7. Regular garbage in boxes
8. Caps left on bottles

- Almena.....Behind Town Hall
- Barron.....Gordy's on LaSalle Ave.
- Barronett.....Town Shop on Highway 63
- Brill.....Next to Town Shop
- Cameron.....Behind Cameron Auto Body
- Canton.....Town Shop on Highway M
- Chetek.....Across from Treatment Plant on Water St.
- Cumberland.....Holiday Gas Station
- Dallas.....Behind the Fire Hall
- Haugen.....Corner of Raymond and 3rd St.
- Loc Lommond.....Storage Area
- Mikana.....Cedar Lake Town Shop
- Prairie Farm.....Town Shop north of Village
- Reeve.....Next to Town Hall
- Stanford.....Town Shop at Highway 25 and 48
- Turtle Lake.....Rail Way Park
