



- ❖ 305 Screened-in Access Reports
- ❖ 166 were related to Alcohol, Meth or other Illicit Drugs

Unborn Child Abuse

“To recognize that unborn children have certain basic needs which must be provided for, including the need to develop physically to their potential and the need to be free from physical harm due to the habitual lack of self-control of their expectant mothers in the use of alcohol beverages, controlled substances or controlled substance analogs, exhibited to a severe degree.....”

2018 Unborn Child Abuse


- ❖ 21 referrals for unborn child abuse
 - 11 Screen-in for Assessment
 - 10 screen-out for Assessment

2018 Ongoing Child Protective Services Case Management

118 of the screened in, investigated and transferred to ongoing services cases were Alcohol, Meth or other Illicit Drug related

- ❖ 7 Alcohol cases
- ❖ 81 Meth cases
- ❖ 30 other Illicit Drugs

Children in Out of Home Care



Children in Out of Home Care

- ❖ 93 total children were placed in OHC in 2018
- ❖ 81 children were placed due to Meth or other illicit drug use by caregiver

Outpatient Drug and Alcohol Assessments

- ❖ Alcohol was Drug of Choice -1
- ❖ Meth was Drug of Choice - 31
- ❖ Other Illicit Drug (s) were Drug of Choice - 13

Intensive Outpatient Substance Use Disorder Group (Men)

This group serves as an outpatient treatment group for men with diagnosed Substance Use Disorders. The Intensive Outpatient group meets 3 days per week for 6 weeks. The Aftercare group then meets 1 time per week for 12 weeks.

15 participants in the Intensive Outpatient group

15 participants in the Aftercare group

Psycho-Education Group (Women)

Originated in Fall of 2018 to provide gender specific Substance Use Disorder Treatment (evidence based principle)

- ❖ 14 total participates currently
- ❖ 10 participants have Meth as primary drug of choice

Drug and Alcohol Court

Drug and Alcohol Treatment Court was implemented in Barron County in 2009. This program serves residents in Barron County who commit felony level crimes which could result in Prison. The program focuses on accountability and recovery from addiction.

- ❖ 11 current participants
 - 9 participants have Meth as primary drug of choice or co-occurring with other substances including alcohol
 - 2 participants have alcohol as primary drug of choice
